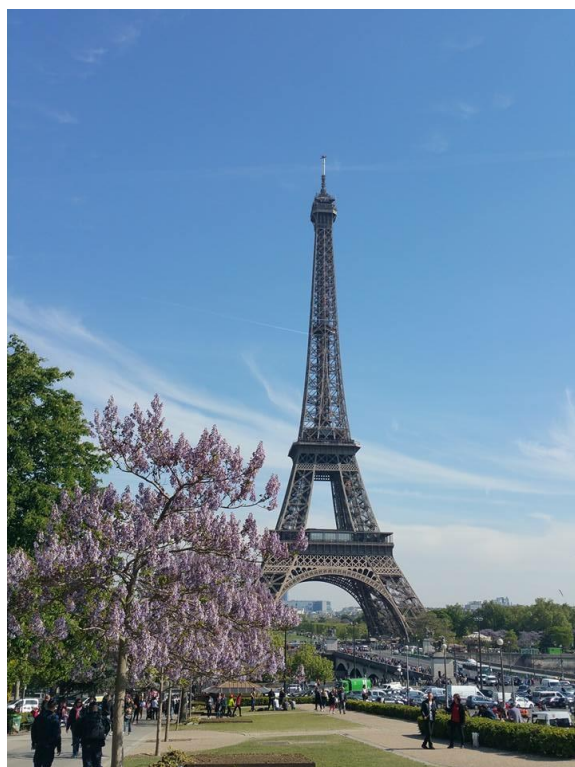

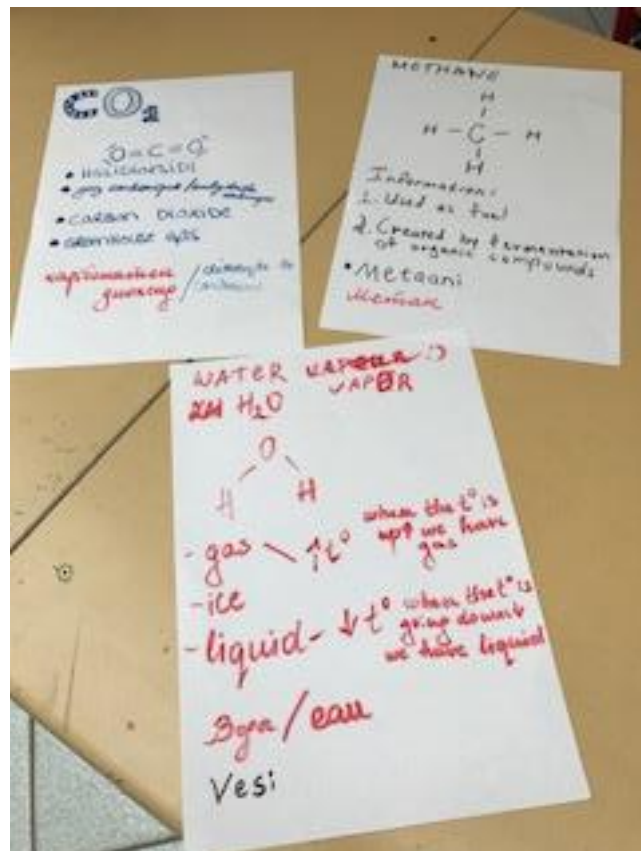

We then all left Paris and got back to our homes, all extinguished! In my opinion, wednesday was a really wonderful day!

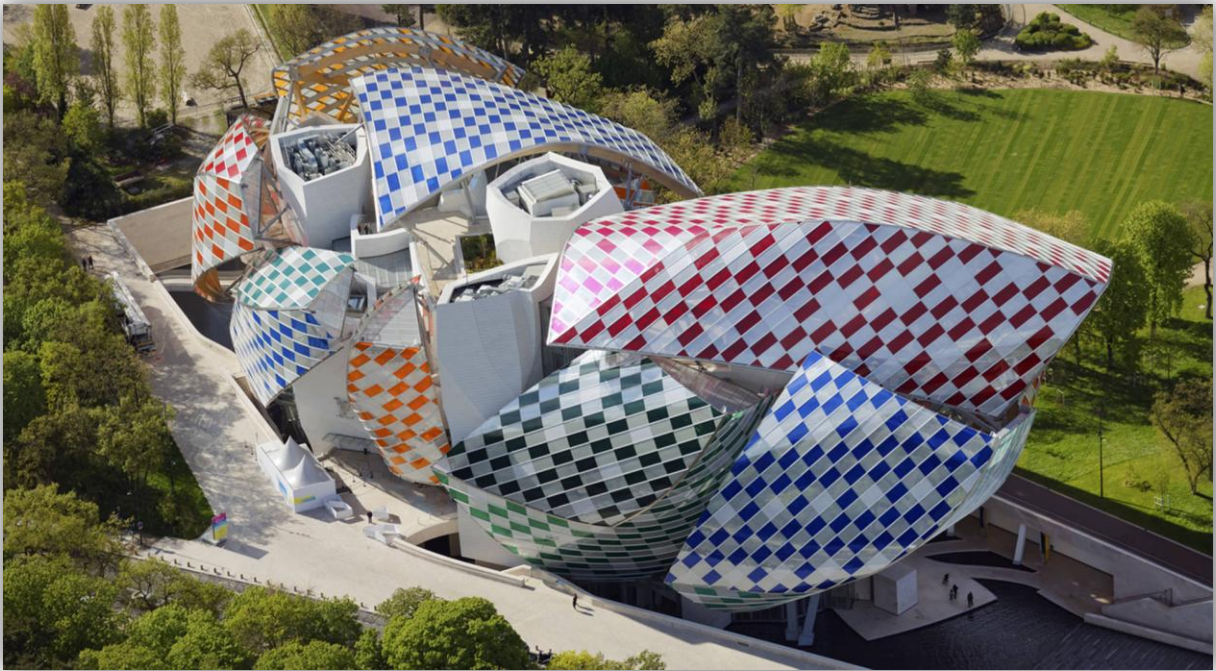

Thursday 27th April

Thursday we went to the fondation Louis Vuitton in the morning. But first things first, to get there, we of course took the train, but funny enough, this museum is located in the middle of the Bois de Boulogne, this may sound perfectly normal to any outsider of France, but well, once you learn a little about this place, you understand that this place is mostly known for 'having fun paying ladies » if you waht I mean ! Sorry I was out of the subject there, but this was necessary to say. Arriving to the foundation we were given a tour of it in english. Before the visit of the current exposition, the guides first explained the idea behind the shape of this building :



As you can see, the building is quite weirdly shaped but the reason of it is because Franck Gehry who built it wanted to break « building rules » by not having a tower like building.

That's why the building in itself is a work of art, sheep shaped, it was very difficult to construct, but they created new building methods in order to finish their project. We then went inside where we were amazed by the number of paintings and sculptures about slavery, it was really impressive. There was also a part where you had those sculptures and masks which were made out of scrap materials, pretty stunning.

After that we had lunch at the university of Paris Dauphine. Then we went to the Seine and we cruised along the seine on a touristic river boat, it was raining too so it ruined the mood but it was still extremely funny. Then we all went home tired but satisfied.

Friday 28th April
